Recent Bird Sightings

FIELD NOTES from Darin Eastburn

The cold and snowy conditions have kept many of us indoors for the past few weeks, but there have been a few hearty souls who have braved the weather in search of winter birds. Here are some of the highlights of recent bird sightings. At Meadowbrook Park and the U of I Forestry area there have been reports of American Robins, Cedar Waxwings, Northern Harrier, Great Blue Heron, Belted Kingfisher, Carolina Chickadee, Tufted Titmouse, Brown Creeper, Winter Wren, and Eastern Bluebirds. At the First Street pond, Canvasbacks, Mallards, and Canada Geese were observed. In addition to Red Foxes, birders at Weaver Park have seen Northern Flickers, Red-tailed Hawks, a Great Blue Heron, Tree Sparrows, and Juncos. Many waterfowl and other species were reported at Riverbend/Lake of the Woods, including Canada, White-fronted, and Snow Geese; Common Merganser, Gadwall, Mallard, Pintail, and Ruddy Ducks; Red-bellied Woodpecker, Northern Flicker, Downy Woodpecker; Black-capped Chickadee; Tufted Titmouse; White-breasted Nuthatch; Red-breasted Nuthatch; Hermit Thrush; American Robin; Cedar Waxwing; American Tree, Song, White-throated, and White-Crowned Sparrows; Dark-eyed Junco; Cardinal; Purple Finch; Pine Siskin; American Goldfinch; House Sparrow; Starlings; and Cooper's Hawks. At the Middlefork River Forest Preserve, Red-tailed Hawks, Bald Eagle, Cooper's Hawks, and a Screech Owl were seen. Some of the backyard bird sightings have included Dark-eyed Juncos, House Sparrows, Cooper's Hawks, Downy Woodpecker, Starlings, Purple Finch, Pine Siskin, and a Eurasian Collared-Dove. In the general area over the past several weeks there have been sightings of Lapland Longspurs, Snow Buntings, Horned Larks, Northern Harrier, American Kestrel, Wild Turkeys; and the U of I campus Peregrine Falcon makes regular appearances around 4th and Green Streets.

CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT 2010

The Champaign County count was held Saturday, December 18. Twenty-two observers in 10 parties in the field + 3 people at feeders found 62 species of birds, plus 1 during count week. Thanks to all who helped.

EAGLE COUNT 2010

On January 2, three people counted the eagles on or near the Illinois River from Havana to Beardstown. We found 45 eagles that day.



The GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT is coming February 18-21.

Sponsored by National Audubon and Cornell Lab of Ornithology, this is a nationwide count. Locally, Audubon people will be at ANITA PURVES NATURE CENTER from 9AM-3PM on SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 19 to count our birds. Please join us. Weather permitting, we will take a short hike through Busey Woods/Crystal Lake Park at 2 PM to count those birds. You are also encouraged to count on your own, any place, and on as many days as you like, sending in a separate checklist for each day. Call 344-6803 for details.

CONSERVATION CORNER Helen Parker, Conservation Chair DISPOSAL OF UNWANTED ELECTRONIC DEVICES

For those who have electronic devices that they no longer want--it's not legal to send them to the landfill. Mervis Industries will accept them for recycling at Marco Recycling, 302 South Market Street, Champaign, Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. (information from Prairie Rivers Network.)

Also from Prairie Rivers Network: The Tenaska coal-fired power plant project at Taylorville appears to be dead, as a bill to secure a market for their electricity failed in the Illinois Senate.

MANY DEAD BIRDS

An article in the *New York Times* estimates that 100 million birds are killed annually in collisions at windows and similar things. Another 100 million are believed to be killed by cats. Keep your cats indoors!

Perkins Road 1 -3 pm. Meet at Dog Park parking lot on Perkins Road



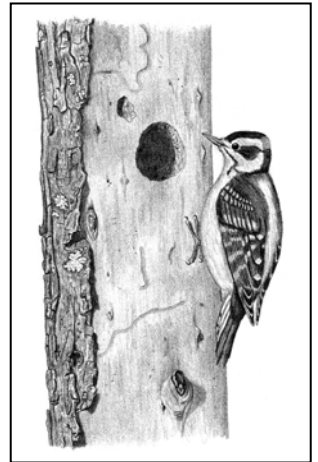
