#### **Field Notes**

We've had an exciting last month of birding here at CCAS. We've begun our Sunday Morning Bird Walks, and though the first week was made difficult by a thick haze, and the birds have been quite skittish, we have still had success in seeing many of our fall migrating warblers. A few highlights were Magnolia Warblers, Blackburnian Warblers, and a Northern Parula.

Our trip to Emiquon was a great success, with over twenty species of shorebirds seen. We saw thousands of American White Pelicans, and while birding the surrounding areas, heard Bobwhite Quails, and saw a Blue Grosbeak. By far the most exciting event of the trip was at Chautauqua, where while watching shorebirds on the mudflats, we suddenly saw all the birds take off, and everything was absolute pandemonium for a few moments. Colin Dobson told us there must be a falcon in the area, and sure enough, when the birds cleared out, a lone Peregrine Falcon remained on the center mudflat, clutching his prize, a yellowlegs. He then proceeded to feed on it for several minutes as we all watched on in excitement.

If you weren't able to join us for the shorebird field trip, don't worry! Our next field trip will be November 6, 2021, to Jasper-Pulaski Wildlife Refuge in Indiana. We will meet around 11am on Saturday at Anita Purves Nature Center parking lot, and head out to Jasper-Pulaski, stopping to do some birding at a few spots along the way. The cranes fly in at sunset, so we will leave Jasper Pulaski after dark, so expect to not get home until late evening. Keep an eye out for more details soon.

## November Point Pleasant: A Paradigm of **Ecological Restoration**

November 4th, 7pm on Zoom

Our November speaker is Peter Goodspeed, Director of Natural Resources for the Champaign County Forest Preserve District! Peter and his team are responsible for restoring and maintaining historically referenced, native ecosystems throughout the forest preserves. In this talk, Peter will discuss the history, ecological restoration, and current management of Point Pleasant, a 180-acre section of the Middle Fork River Forest Preserve and a natural gem in Champaign County.


